Monday 16th February

Pray for James Cochrane, PCI Missionary in Portugal. He is in Ireland to undertake some deputation for around ten days. His wife Heather and their children Alana and Lucy will remain in Portugal during this time.

Tuesday 17th February

Naomi Keefe, Brazil, reports, "The Good News Club now has a space of its own which is exciting.... The 45 children and young folk have already left their mark on one of the walls of the room so it is beginning to look like the 'space' belongs to them which is great!" Give thanks for the new 'space' in the favela for the Club and continue to pray for wisdom as how best to use it.

Wednesday 18th February

Steve Anderson, Spain, asks for prayer for Torre del Mar Christian Community Church. Pray for the new Church Council as they give leadership and for the protection of the congregation as it adapts to active mission in the coming months.

Thursday 19th February

In recent days there have been reports of increased fighting in Ukraine. Pray especially for the Reformed Church in Transcarpathia, as it seeks to continue its ministry and witness and help those in need.

Friday 20th February

Peter and Valerie Lockwood from Kathmandu where they work with United Mission to Nepal (UMN) ask that we give thanks for the work completed to date on UMN's new operational plans and continue to pray as they are finalised and are then sent for government approval.

Saturday 21st February

China is the most populous nation on earth with 1.3 billion people. There are over 450 ethnic groups and 298 languages spoken. Of these only 70 have any Scripture. Pray that minority language speakers would see how valuable translating the Bible can be for their communities and that they would offer to lead the work. Pray too that linguistic, translation and literacy work will benefit communities as well as introducing them to God.

Sunday 22dn February
