

MONDAY 28TH SEPTEMBER: With thoughts of Harvest still in our minds, make a point of thanking God today for the many things He gives but which we often take for granted. Take time to look back and see how “All that is needed His hand has provided”, and trust Him for the future in whatever your circumstances.

TUESDAY 29TH SEPTEMBER: Pray for all those who lead activities in our church.
