Prayer Diary

Monday 12th October: Give thanks for blessings received and lift up to the Lord those who you know that are lonely or in need of care. Pray that they would know God's love and concern for them. Pray for the church committee as they meet on Tuesday evening that they would know God's guidance as they deliberate and make decisions over church matters.

Tuesday 13th October: Pray for the leadership and helpers in our church organisations as they meet throughout the week. Pray that they would know God's wisdom and guidance as they plan and lead. Pray that all who come through the church doors would find God's peace and Christian fellowship as we meet in Jesus name.

Wednesday 14th October: Pray for the governments of the west as they try to work with the huge refugee problem flowing from the Middle East. Pray that God would guide them through this very complex situation.

Thursday 15th October: Remember the people of Israel at this time as they are attacked frequently from within and outside their land and are verbally under threat from Iranian Muslim leaders. Pray also for protection for the growing Christian Church from the Muslim extremists.

Friday 16th October: Pray for our Pastoral team as they visit our sick in hospital, residential care or at home. Pray they would know God's strength and wisdom as they comfort the sick.

Saturday 17th October: Give thanks to God for the faithfulness of our church choir and praise band as they lead us in worship each Sunday. Let us not forget to pray for the media and sound teams as they faithfully work out of sight from the congregation each Sunday.

Sunday 18th October: Pray to God for open ears and receptive hearts to receive His word today. Pray that His messenger will speak with boldness of spirit in proclaiming God's word to us today.
