

Prayer Diary



Worship the Lord in the splendour of his holiness; tremble before him, all the earth.

Psalm 96 v 9

Monday, 9th May: Pray for the work of the Mission Committee meeting this evening and for those to whom we give regular support — the Orrs, the Forjans and Louise Hacking. Pray for our young people as they make plans for the summer, that they may be led to some form of Christian service, which will help them to grow in the faith.

Tuesday, 10th May: Pray for Mark, our treasurer, as he prepares the finances each week. Ask God to bless all those on the Finance Committee and the Property Committee, that they may have wisdom in dealing with the practical needs of the church.

Wednesday, 11th May: Pray for the work of Thursday Together tomorrow as they come to the end of their year. Thank God for Gloria and the leaders, who have served faithfully throughout this year. Pray that God's presence will be real to all the members and to any who are ill at this time.

Thursday, 12th May: Continue to pray for Gloria and Sebastian in their work in Slovenia.
