Prayer Diary

Worship the Lord in the splendour of his holiness; tremble before him, all the earth.

Psalms 96 v 9

Monday, 19th September: Ask God to bless the members of Presbyterian Women meeting this evening in fellowship. Pray that more ladies in the congregation would feel able to join them and learn more about God's work in our community. Pray for Christine Kyle as she shares information this evening about the work of deaconesses.

Tuesday, 20th September: Give thanks to God for the fellowship we enjoy as a congregation. Pray for members of session as they meet this evening to consider how we can be good witnesses to the gospel. Ask God to bless Derek as he undertakes the role of clerk and for each member to humbly seek and pursue God's will for the congregation.

Wednesday, 21st September: Pray for the work of Thursday Together tomorrow. Thank God for Gloria and the leaders, who serve faithfully throughout the year. Pray that God's presence will be real to all the members as they meet together and especially near to any who are ill at this time.

Thursday, 22nd September: Continue to pray for Gloria and Sebastian in their work in Slovenia. Give thanks for their faithfulness in the work of God's kingdom and ask God to bless them with good health and wisdom. Pray for God's clear guidance in the preaching and counselling tasks they undertake. Pray too for their three little sons as they grow up.
