CATERING AT FUNERALS: For sometime now we have struggled to cope with the demand upon our volunteers when funerals are held in our church, simply due to the increased demand over recent years. We wish to be in a position to offer the use of our church in such circumstances to all our members, so in order to do so, we have decided to place certain stipulations on the use of our halls for catering at funerals so that volunteers are not obliged to stay around for almost a full day. Here are our guidelines:

- The church committee does not organise catering at 1) funerals (this would oblige us in very strict food safety regulations).
- 2) The committee will make the church halls available for catering to family and friends of the deceased or we will offer a preferred list of outside caterers for the family to make arrangements with.
- 3) Catering after a funeral must be scheduled immediately after the service and before the committal service at the grave yard.
- 4) There will be a discretionary charge of £100 for the use of halls for catering at a funeral.
