Roof and Renovation Update

We would like to keep the congregation informed of our financial progress now that we have made the first stage payment to the contractor.

At the beginning we had the following in the bank:

Pre existing roof fund - £2,000

Dunlop Fund - £50,000

Total therefore - £52,000

Income since then:

Direct giving - £73,631

Gift Aid - £209

Transferred from Property Fund - £21,220.25

Transferred from General Fund - £15,128

Transferred from Thursday Together - £30

Total income therefore - £110,218.25

Grand total of funds gathered so far therefore is £162,218.25

This is £72,781.75 short of our expected project cost of £235,000.

In the meantime we will use £70,000 of interest free loans already received. The target still ahead for the congregation to reach is £72,781.

Please note that while the scaffolding remains up we recommend that the church halls are not used during the evening.

THE FRIDAY CLUB: A new ministry for children and young people in the church on a Friday evening.

Bible based - Christ centred - Fun filled - Church enriching.

Vision - an introduction to Christianity and the promotion of discipleship of the whole person: spiritual, emotional, mental, physical and social.

For Children P1 to P7 - often meeting in two groups, where the older children will play an important role in the leadership of the evening.

For Young People - Secondary School age. The programme will often involve the young people in leading their group and training to be leaders in the children's work.

Important aspect will be the ongoing training of leaders and potential leaders in effective ministry to children and young people. This will include training in leading praise, use of modern media, special needs, missions, ministry to children, ministry to young people etc
