Prayer Diary

As we pray this week, let us meditate on these words from Colossians chapter 1. The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.

Monday: 'Image of the invisible God' - Christ made His Father known through his life and ministry. Let us give thanks to our God, who seeks to make himself known to all people.

Tuesday: 'In Him all things were created' - Jesus was present with the Father and Holy Spirit at the creation of the world. Pray for the environmental impact that mankind has upon it. Pray that industry and governments alike will take a more responsible approach to their care of the planet.

Wednesday: 'Thrones or powers or rulers or authorities' -Pray for our leaders; local, national and global, as they daily make decisions that impact our lives and the communities we live in. Pray that they will be open to God's leading in the choices they make.

Thursday: 'He is before all things' - There are many things that worry and concern us. Take comfort today in knowing that Christ is, as He has always been, before all things.

Friday: 'He is the head of the body, the church' - The Church is a tremendous gift to God's people and offers great help and support to believers and non-believers alike. Pray for those whom God chooses to use to lead His Church, and pray too for the witness that the church gives to the world.

Saturday: 'Firstborn from among the dead' - Christ has defeated death! Not only does that mean that He is still with us, but also that those who trust in Him will enjoy eternal life with him. Praise God for Christ's sacrifice that has bought us life.

Sunday: 'So that in everything he might have the supremacy' - let us give thanks and praise to our God and King, who has no equal, and cannot be defeated. May we seek to honour Him in all we do.
