Mission Updates

PROJECT ROMANIA: Hello dear friends

Just a quick update about Romania. Unfortunately our flight was cancelled before we got to Romania but we can see God's grace and goodness to us. We were told if we had come we would be isolated for 2 weeks and if we had any infection could be imprisoned and fined up to 4000 euros. We were able to provide food for a village and Hordu with some friends distributed it. Our ministry at the moment consists mainly in prayer and Preaching through messenger when opportunities arise. We are also in contact with Laslea Hospital which is totally locked down. In relation to summer work 3 of our teams have cancelled which is fully understandable so it looks like we will not be in Romania until potentially the autumn. The problem is there is little or no testing in Romania, borders are closed and the police and army are guarding the roads. There is no real idea of how many have died and if they have reached the peak yet. It is frustrating but totally out of our hands. God is in control and we bless Him for His protection to us and pray for His provision to all our dear friends in Romania. We daily pray for them and also for the many teams that have supported us over the years and their local churches. Keep well keep, safe. God loves you and so do we. With love Norman and Linda

Sunday 3 May - Spiritual life

Pray for parents who cannot stay home from work but must find care for their children, asking that God would help them find and sustain safe and creative solutions.

Wednesday 6 May - Congregational finances
Pray for congregations as the normal link between
going to church and giving to its work is broken, asking
that God will continue to provide what is needed to
sustain necessary finances during the period of
lockdown.

Pray for God's wisdom and strength for the Finance Department in Assembly Buildings as they continue to oversee the wider financial management of the denomination and attend to everyday matters of payment of ministers and staff while operating with a skeleton staff.

Thursday 7 May - Difficult decisions

Pray for decision makers at all levels of government as they receive advice from specialists, interpret data and shape policy that they would be wise in their decision-making and clear in their communication to others. Pray particularly for governments on our own island and across the world as they navigate the fine lines of easing lockdown measures at the right pace, asking for God's wisdom in judging the balances required.

Friday 8 May - VE Day commemorations

As we mark the ending of the war in Europe at this time 75 years ago, give thanks to God for the selfless and courageous service and sacrifice of those who brought peace to Europe, acknowledging the great cost to all nations in the conflict.

Pray for nations still devastated by war, for their people and their leaders; for those who suffer the effects or memories of past wars; for veterans; for those who mourn; for all innocent victims whose lives have been shattered by the cruelty of others.

Saturday 9 May - *Volunteering and local ministry* Give thanks for the many people who are using this time to volunteer in their local communities, asking that their simple acts of kindness would continue to make a big difference in the lives of the most vulnerable.

Pray particularly for churches as they serve those around them, asking that the relationships built would provide opportunities to show and share the good news and hope that comes through faith in Jesus Christ.


