SAFE CHURCH: As you know GPC has been signed up as a Safe Church for anyone experiencing Domestic Abuse. It was revealed last month that:

- the number of domestic abuse crimes rose to 18,885, an increase of 1,569 (9.1%) on the previous 12 months
- ◆ the largest volume increase in domestic abuse crimes was seen in offences of harassment (including malicious communications) which increased by 1,270 (49.8 per cent).
- there was a higher level of incidents recorded during the height of lockdown with 291 more incidents in April and 258 more in May than in the same months in 2019

We would like to draw your attention to Domestic Abuse Awareness Webinars hosted by our council and are open to anyone in the congregation. Most sessions are morning or afternoon, which won't suit many, but please check the link and speak to Lesley Bell, Davy Mullan or Hazel Kyle if you're interested and want more information:



Prayer Diary

Sunday 6 December

- At home for Christmas Following on from the weekend of prayer, pray for the Moderator's Christmas initiative, that there might be a good response to the financial appeal as we look outwards to our partner churches in South Sudan, Malawi, Indonesia, Nepal, Lebanon, Syria and Romania.


