Prayer Diary

Sunday 17 April: Give thanks for the triumph, eternal hope and celebration of the risen Saviour this Resurrection Sunday. Pray that, this Easter, we might affirm our trust and reliance upon God as we are reminded that we are Resurrection people.

Monday 18 April: Steve & Rosie Kennedy (global mission workers, Romania) | Pray for Tóköz Reformed congregation in Cluj, as they seek to provide emotional, pastoral and practical support to refugees from Ukraine. Pray too for Steve and Rosie as they continue to reach out to the English-speaking community in Cluj.

Tuesday 19 April: Hospital admissions due to Covid-19 reflect the incidence of the virus in wider society. Thank God for progress made with vaccinations and for the increasing ability to manage successive variants. Continue to pray for our frontline staff as they work heroically onwards.

Wednesday 20 April: The situation for the Presbyterian Church of Myanmar (PCM) has become increasingly difficult under the military coup. At present villages with PCM members are being bombed, with homes, businesses and churches destroyed. Some PCM members have been killed and injured. Shops and offices are closed, prices are rocketing higher every day. Pray for an immediate end to the attacks.

Thursday 21 April: Give thanks for the freedom of the press that we enjoy across the UK and Ireland. Pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ who have made journalism their career, that they would be salt and light in their places of work and amongst the many people they meet throughout the course of their work.

Friday 22 April: Tritonville Close is a complex of sheltered accommodation for older people in the Sandymount area of Dublin. Established in 1948, it became the Presbyterian Church in Ireland's first project in the Republic of Ireland. Pray for Richard Zipser, Manager, for wisdom and guidance in caring for the residents. Pray for all those involved in the daily lunch club. Give thanks for the good relationships between staff and residents.

Saturday 23 April: Heather Healy and Cathy Smith, two student deaconesses, are reaching the end of their first college year and preparing to serve full-time over the summer in their placement congregations. Pray for them, that the Lord will use this period to prepare and equip them for future service.
