Prayer Diary

Sunday 1 May: Come, let us sing for joy to the LORD; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Psalm 95:1 Ask God to help us respond to his invitation to find joy in him as we express our praise in song today.

Monday 2 May: Please pray for our farmers, who are facing unprecedented rises in their key inputs. Over the past year fertilizer has risen by some 300%, while fuel and feed have increased by 200%. The pig sector is suffering particularly at the moment, but all areas of the industry are being hit extremely hard.

Tuesday 3 May: Pray for peace in South Sudan, where there has recently been a surge of violence, including rapes, gang rapes, beheadings, burning civilians alive, and attacks on humanitarian aid workers. Pray too for the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan and its work to promote peace and its humanitarian aid work.

Wednesday 4 May: Pray for our partners in Latvia, the Evangelical Reformed Church of Latvia and the Baltic Reformed Theological Seminary. Pray for their work and witness, including reaching out to help refugees from Ukraine.

Thursday 5 May: Tom Dowling (Irish mission

worker, Kilkenny) | Pray for door-to-door visitation, that the Spirit of God will be at work in the lives of those Tom and others meet. Pray too for outreach Bible studies, taking place both inperson and online, and for the planning of a summer children's club which will be held in a local community centre.

Friday 6 May: As the election results become known today pray for those who have been elected to serve in the NI Assembly, and especially those who will be entering Stormont for the first time, that their decision-making would be characterised by wisdom and compassion. Pray that those who have not been elected, or have lost their seats will quickly come to terms with their disappointment and find new ways to serve their local community.

Saturday 7 May: Give thanks for the work and witness of Thompson House in its work with male offenders. Pray for safety for David Farrow, Director and the staff team; for wisdom, patience, love and understanding in dealing with residents. Give thanks that 4 residents are taking part in and enjoying a Bible study; pray their hearts will be opened.
