Prayer Diary

Pray for all involved in our Holiday Bible Club which is planned for the end of July. Pray that God would give us a burden to get alongside our children and encourage them in their faith. Pray that children connected with our church family and those from the community would be excited to come along and hear about Jesus and how he wants to have a relationship with them.

Pray for those who find the school holiday period challenging due to complexities in home life, financial uncertainty, or missing the routine and structure that term time brings. Pray that families would be able to access appropriate support, and that we would have eyes to see those whom we can draw alongside at these times.

Pray for the McCormick family as they take leave and benefit from the quieter church life of the summer. Pray for refreshment and renewed energy and vision from the Lord as Reuben prepares for the new church year, especially after such disruption to congregational ministry and mission over the past two-and-a-half years.

The Specialist Services Committee of PCI oversees the work of Carlisle House, Thompson House and Gray's Court – facilities which offer care and services to those with addictions, past offending behaviour and who require short/mid-term supported housing. Give thanks for the service the staff at each facility offer. Pray also for wisdom for their respective team leaders, David Cuthbert, David Farrow and Frances Craig.

Give thanks for plans for a new Special Ministry in West Belfast and for the appointment of Rev David Moore, minister to the post. Pray for him as he prepares to take up the role from September.

Give thanks for those who open their homes to children and young people who can no longer be cared for by their own families. Pray that more people would come forward to offer help and support in this way, and particularly for refugee children who arrive in Northern Ireland and Ireland unaccompanied.

Pray for people across the world dependent on food aid and for the aid agencies helping them. There are increasing concerns of a global hunger catastrophe unfolding fuelled by the facts that grain is trapped in Ukraine, the protectionist policies of other significant grain producers, and a poor harvest in East Africa.
